I am sad to report that this past November the Shooting Community lost our current ATA President, William Anzaldi. The loss of another shooter and our ATA President hurts our association deeply. As of now the ATA has not announced a succession plan for the remainder of the shoot year. I anticipate this will be done shortly, as the Executive Committee will be conducting meetings this month. As most of you know the PITA letter of Agreement between the ATA and PITA, which established guidelines for the cross registration of targets, was rescinded. The official cancellation of the LOA was at the end of October. Through many discussions the LOA has once again been signed between the ATA and PITA. The new LOA will continue the practice of cross registration between both organizations.

There are several issues that as of yet have not been fully addressed or understood. The first one is the impact that such an agreement has on ATA clubs in California and the new LOA still does not cover the mandatory half yard for scores of 96. As we all know, the ATA handicap system requires a mandatory half yard punch for scores of 96. The current PITA system does not punch for scores of 96. This is an issue that will be discussed further and an issue I will monitor.

The LOA is a work in progress that will be evaluated annually to make sure it meets the needs of the ATA. PITA has posted the LOA on their web site. At this time the ATA has not posted any information or the new forms that are required for members who cross register targets from the ATA to PITA. The CGSTA Board was briefed on the LOA during their December 4th, 2010 board meeting. According to the LOA it is the CGSTA's discretion to monitor "close proximity" so clubs do not schedule shoots on the same days as other clubs. The board also discussed the impact that cross registered targets could have on State Team selections.

Questions of Your Delegate

This will be the section where I will take several of the questions I receive during the quarter and answer them here. Please, if you have questions don't hesitate to ask me or you're CGSTA Board Members. My email address is california_ata@yahoo.com.

Question 1- Why are the CGSTA minutes not posted after the meeting?

This is actually standard procedure for the CGSTA Board. The minutes of the meeting need to be approved by the Board of Directors before they are official. After the minutes are official (voted on) then they are posted for the CGSTA Members. Unfortunately when there are just a few meetings that are held each shooting year the minutes take a little longer to be posted. The board minutes are generally posted after the following CGSTA Board Meetings that occur in February, June, September (as needed), and December. There are a lot of issues that concern board meetings and some of the information can be found in the CGSTA Bylaws and the Robert's Rules of Order.

There was a recent internet thread regarding the ATA minutes not being posted in a timely manner. Neil Winston and Pat Ireland covered the posting of the ATA minutes. The CGSTA's procedures appear to mirror the ATA's procedures.

Question 2- Why are there no CGSTA Directors working the local shoots?

In years past, Directors were asked by the gun clubs to attend and handicap at registered shoots in California. There was also possibly a time when they may have been required to work shoots on the CGSTA's behalf. Based on the ATA rules and CGSTA procedures we discovered the Directors who worked these shoots were not working as an official for the CGSTA or the ATA. The ATA rules are very specific as to what responsibilities are imposed on the gun clubs that hold registered shoots. When Directors attend any shoot they are there on their own time and are not there on behalf of the CGSTA or the ATA. The below rule is from the ATA rule book, page 10, section C:

1. Shoot Management should arrange for:
 - a. capable classifying and handicapping personnel who shall classify and handicap all shooters in accordance with the Official Rules; and
 - b. competent cashiers who will calculate purses and options correctly and pay off as many events as possible before the close of the shoot; and
 - c. squadding personnel (Note - at small shoots, all three (3) of the above may be done by the same person or persons)....
