Rec'd: Via Mail from the ATA. The CGSTA 2013 State Rebate from the ATA. This year the CGSTA will receive 12,228.00 for their yearly rebate.

Delegates Report:

As this was an additional meeting to the normal number of meeting the CGSTA holds per year there was no Delegates Report.

New or Replacement Directors:

None at this time from any Zone.

Old Business:

The business at hand was the State Shoot site contract. The CGSTA and the KGC (Kingsburg Gun Club) met on Dec 15 th with 2 members from each organization present to represent each other's interests. The proposed contract was presented to the CGSTA Board of Directors at this meeting. It was stated to the Board that the contract as presented had some additions to it that were sent to the negotiation committee by KGC after the December 15 th Meeting. These additions were marked for clarity. With much
discussion and a statement by President Hauge that at this time the only viable location was Kingsburg and time was getting short,
Motion VerHalen Second Wood; To approve the contract, without the added wording, as worked out with KGC on December 15 th , 2012. With Modifications to state that at 0.23 cents the KGC will secure a trap mechanic, and KGC will provide labor for the shoot offs. Motion Passed: Voice Vote
Another State Shoot matter was brought to the floor. The matter concerning the cost of targets to the shooter at the 2013 Calif State Shoot was brought forward at this time. With discussion as to the different options for prices being brought up; Motion Piazza Second C.Hammond To charge \$34.00 per hundred targets for adult shooters at the 2013 California State Shoot.

Again a matter concerning target cost for shooters, this time being the cost per hundred for Junior shooters was brought to the floor. With much discussion being brought to the front about the cost that had in previous years been charged to the junior shooters and the rising cost of trophies; Motion
To set the cost of Junior targets at the 2013 California State Shoot at \$30.00 per hundred. With the
statement that once junior shooter plays the options he/she is no longer able to shoot for junior prices at the 2013 California State Shoot. If a shooter wishes to play options at any time during the state shoot he/she will pay full price for the entire tournament.

A matter concerning the state shoot cashiering was brought to the floor. CH Shoot Reports put in a bid to do the cashiering for the 2013 state shoot. CH Shoot Reports will be using the 3S system. Another bid was put in by Norm Valponi at the conclusion of the 2012 state shoot this bid was given verbally to the Treasurer Hammond. Norm Valponi uses the Shoot compute system. With some discussion as to the cost of each of these bids,
