He noted the continued success in the SCTP program and thanked the clubs, coaches, parents, and volunteers that made that possible. He noted the improvements to our website and some new ideas for more improvements to come. He acknowledged the efforts of countless directors and others that made this state shoot such a success. And he noted the personal accomplishments of Vince Compolongo and Doug Gustafson who both completed their grand slams at Kingsburg this week!

President Slough concluded his remarks with a brief discussion of two projects that have been on the back burner for the past year... replacing the concrete walkways on banks C through G and building retaining walls behind G Bank to make more room for everyone. He reported that we continue to explore fundraising efforts for both of these projects and will continue our efforts into the coming year.

Following President Slough, Ray Brasser gave a brief report of the Clay Target Summit recently held at San Antonio, hosted by White Flyer Targets. This meeting was intended as a forum to discuss problems facing the clay sports associations on a national level, but brought home a number of problems facing California. There were a number of national programs available to gun clubs to improve their chances of survival in today's environment, and we needed someone on the CGSTA Board to help our clubs take advantage of these resources. There were a number of programs available to help us with our membership, and we needed to look at ways to take advantage of these programs. We needed to do a better job of promoting our sport in California and we needed to do a better job of fundraising. He looked forward to discussing these ideas with the Board in the coming year.

In closing, Past President Yamguchi presented President Slough with a President's leather shooting bag and a Past-President's pin. The association thanked Bob for his efforts and leadership throughout the year.
